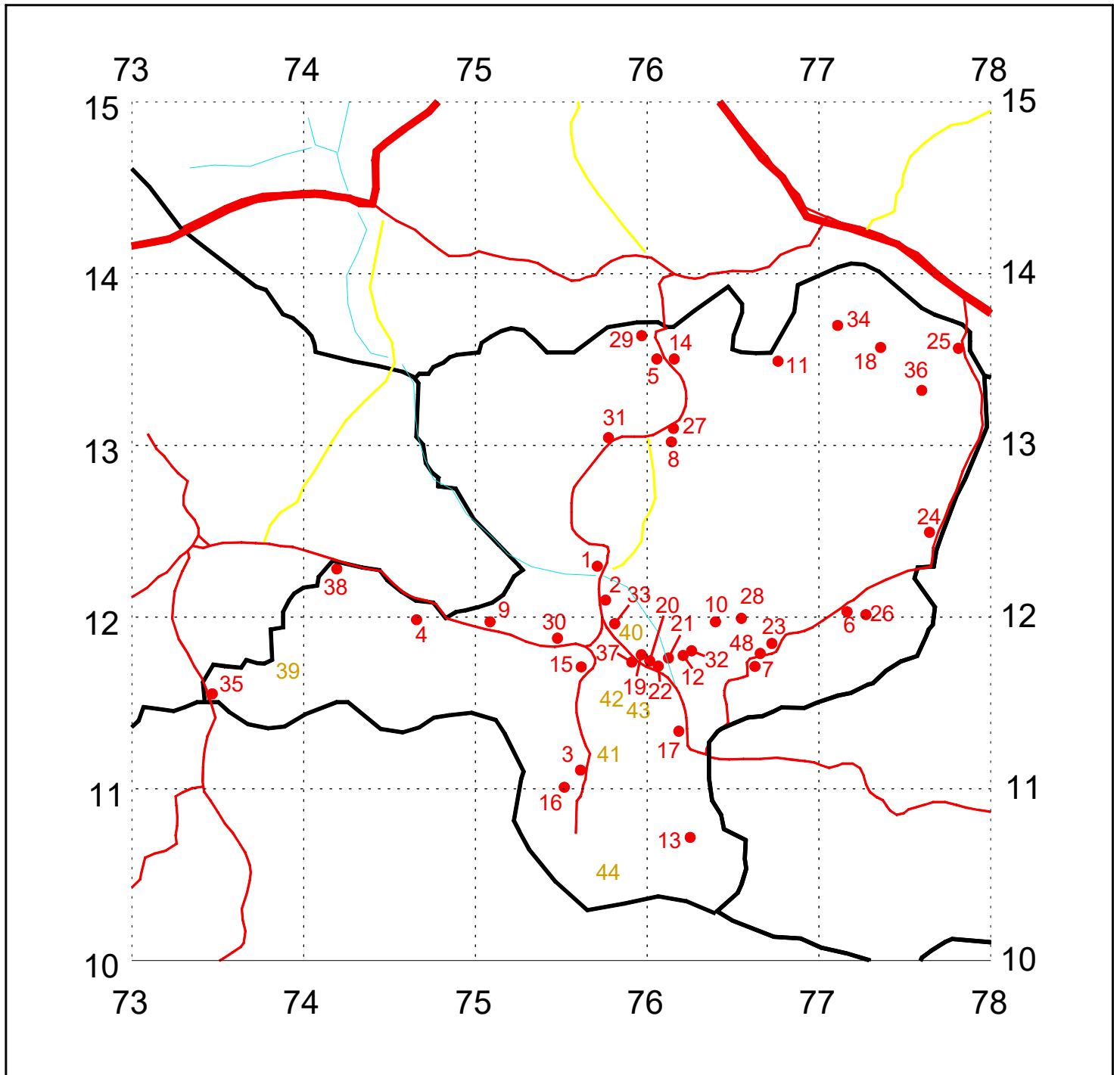

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**CROWHURST - COURT LODGE [P12/1]**

Demesne of Crowhurst Manor.

**DETAILS OF PROPERTY**

<1841-1841+ Ho, bldgs + 243a. + wood. Described in tithe award as 243a excluding wood. [1]

**DETAILS OF BUILDINGS**

1627 Room in the manor house reserved for holding of the manorial courts and a little closet or study on the north side of the hall reserved for the use of Peter Farnden, who ran the iron works at Crowhurst. [2]

1662 Not located in Hearth Tax, unless 'Alice Fuller, widow, 5 flues' relates to this property. It could relate to Oasthouse Farm (P12/30). [9]

**DETAILS OF OWNERSHIP**

<1210-1211+ Pet Scotney He held 9.5 fees by service of standard bearer to the Count of Eu and Castle Ward at Hastings. [3]

<1245-1259 Walt Scotney Son of Peter. In 1245 he received a grant of free warren in Crowhurst. He was chief steward to Richard, Earl of Gloucester and was convicted of administering poison to the earl and his half-brother. For this he was executed in 1259 and his lands escheated to the Crown. [3]

1259 Dav Gormunvill He held the property for three months, probably as a Crown official. [3]

1259-1262 Edw Eldest son of the King and overlord of the Rape of Hastings. In 1262 he restored the property and the Rape to the King, for the benefit of Peter of Savoy, in exchange for other lands. [3,4]

1262-1268 Pet of Savoy Overlord of the Rape of Hastings. He died in 1268. [3]

1268-1305 John de Bretagne, Earl of Richmond and overlord of the Rape of Hastings. He had married Beatrice, daughter of Henry III. An unsuccessful claim was made on the property by Peter of Savoy's heirs in 1270, and in 1277, upon his return from the Crusades, the property was confirmed to John. In 1290, and again in 1295, the property was temporarily in the King's hands due to the Earl's neglect of his duties to the King, but both were short-lived. John died in 1305. [3,4]

1305-1334 John Bretagne, Earl of Richmond & Overlord of the Rape of Hastings. The rightful heir to the Earldom was Arthur, but he was in arms against England, so the Earldom reverted to Arthur's brother, John. His properties were forfeited for a while in 1326 when he sided with the King of France. He died in 1334. [3,4]

1334-1341 John Bretagne, Duke of Brittany, Earl of Richmond and Overlord of the Rape of Hastings. He was the nephew of John, being son of Arthur, Duke of Brittany. He died without legitimate issue in 1341. [4]

1342-1372 John of Gaunt He was granted the property when he was made Earl of Richmond by his father, the King, in 1342 when aged 3

1372-1381	John	de Montfort,	years. In 1362 he was created Duke of Lancaster. He resigned the Earldom of Richmond (and thus his overlordship of the Rape of Hastings and his ownership of Crowhurst) in 1372. [4]
1399-	Rlph	Neville,	Duke of Brittany. He had married Joan, half-sister of Richard II, and in 1372 was created Earl of Richmond and overlord of the Rape of Hastings. In 1381 the property was forfeited when John sided with France, but the demesne manors of the Rape were granted for the maintainance of Joan. [3,4]
1425-1428	John	Pelham	Earl of Westmorland. He was made Earl of Richmond by Henry IV in 1399, and with the Earldom went the Rape of Hastings and Crowhurst Manor. He died in 1425. [3,4]
1428-1439	Joan	Pelham	Illegitimate son of Sir John who, in 1412 was granted the reversion of the manor after the death of the Earl of Westmorland, which occurred in 1425. Upon the death of his father the property was granted to John's mother in dower [3]
1439-1466	John	Pelham, Kt.	Widow of Sir John and mother of John. She held in dower. [3]
1466-1466+		Pelham	He had initially been granted the property in 1425, but effectively only obtained possession in 1439 upon the death of his mother. In 1445 the Rape of Hastings (effectively in the King's hands since 1425, though the Pelhams had assumed that they held it) was obtained by Thomas Hoo and Sir John was forced to hold the manor (together with Bur-wash & Bivelham) in socage. In 1465 Sir John's right to the three manors was acknowledged and from this date they were held direct of the King. He died in 1466. [3]
<1503-1503	John	Pelham	Widow of Sir John, by whos will she held a life interest. [3]
1503-1516	Will	Pelham	Son of Sir John. He died without issue. [3]
1516-1516+	Thos	Pelham	Brother of John & son of Sir John. He to died without issue. [3]
<1560-1560	Will	Pelham	Brother of John & William and son of Sir John. He died holding the property in 1516. [3]
1560-1580	Nich	Pelham, Kt.	Second son of Thomas. [3]
1580-1585+	John	Pelham, Kt.	Son of William. He died seized of the manor in 1560. [3]
<1604-1624	Jdth	Pelham	He died holding the property in 1580.
1624-1654	Thos	Pelham, Bart.	Widow of Sir John. She held Crowhurst as part of her jointure and outlived their infant son, who died in 1585. [3]
1654-1669+	Thos	Pelham, Bart.	Brother of John & uncle of the deceased infant son. In 1591 he had obtained the overlordship of the Rape of Hastings and the two now once more descended together. He was created a baronet in 1611 and died in 1624. [3,4]
<1674-1674+	John	Pelham, Bart.	Overlord of the Rape of Hastings. He was son of Sir Thomas and was aged 27 yrs in 1624. He died in 1654 aged 57 yrs. [2,3,4]
<1704-1704+	Mrgt	Pelham	Overlord of the Rape of Hastings. Eldest son of Thomas by his first wife. He was confirmed to the title in 1669, but settled or conveyed the property soon after. From this date Crowhurst and the overlordship of the Rape descend separately. [3,4]
<1708-1756+	Nich	Pelham, Kt.	Second wife of Thomas Pelham, Esq. She was in 1674 holding the manor on behalf of her own son, Nicholas, the half-brother of Sir John. [3]
<1770-1786	Thos	Pelham	Son of Sir John by Margaret. By 1708 he had settled the property upon his own son, although Nicholas did not die until 1739. [3]
<1838-1838	John	Cresset-Pelham	Son of Sir Nicholas. [3]
	John	Cresset-Pelham	Son of Thomas. Between 1760 & 1765 John Pelham acquired Crowhurst Park from Jamas Pelham and from this date the Crowhurst Demesne (including this property) formed part of Crowhurst Park Estate (see P12/18). John died in 1786. [3,5]
	Hen	Cresset-Pelham	Son of Thomas & brother of John. He took the name Cresset, becoming Cresset-Pelham. [3]
	John	Cresset-Pelham	Son of Henry. He died un-married in 1838. [3]

1838-1841+	Thursley & Papillion	Henry's sisters, Frances (wife of Rev George Augustus Thursby) and Anne (wife of Col. Thomas Papillon) were his co-heirs. [1,3]

1627-1627+	John	Fuller	Peter Farnden of Sedlescombe held this property by lease dated 1627, and he sublet to John Fuller of Crowhurst. A room within the manor house was reserved to the owner for holding the manorial courts, and in addition Peter Farnden reserved for his own use a little closet or study on the north side of the hall. [2]
<1692-1707	John	Fuller	In 1702 the poll tax returns show his 'adult' household as comprising himself + his wife. His farm labourers (William Fuller and Richard Burnet) were housed in Bowership (P12/27). John and Thomas Stunt occupied another house on the demesne, (location unknown - possibly part of Court Lodge) and in 1706 they were assessed in the land tax returns for half of Court Lodge. In 1702 the land tax on Stunt's part was paid by the owner. John Fuller died in 1707. [5,7,8]
<1715-1740+	John	Stunt	He had previously tenanted part of Court Lodge (see above) and now became tenant of the whole, except the woodland, which was in hand. [5]
<1743-1775	Hen	Byne	In 1743 he held Court Lodge Farm at an annual rent of £120. From 1745-1750 Woodland in hand, from 1755-1765 leased with the plainland. From <1770-1775+ half of the plainland & all the woodland was hed by the owner. [5,6]
<1785-1785+			Land Tax paid by the owner - possibly the farm was in hand. [5]
<1790-1790+	Will	Neeve	[5]
<1795-1825+	John	Pelham	He was owner-occupier of the land. [5]
<1830-1841+	Ben	Larkin.	[1,5]

1721-1729	John	Staley, labourer	Of Hastings in 1721. He held of the lord by renewed lease for 21 years from 1721 at 5/- per annum. In 1724 he mortgaged the lease for £12 to James Philcox of Battle, leather cutter. He assigned the lease in 1729. [1,2,3]
1729-1730	Anne	Sargent, widow	When assigned in 1729 Anne Sargent was of Hastings. She acquired the property with James Philcox, leather worker of Battle, to whom the property had been mortgaged in 1724. The assignment may be a foreclosure. In 1730 Anne Sargent conveyed the remainder of the term of the lease to William Hammond of Battle. [1,3]
1730-1737+	Will	Hammond	Of Battle. He was owner of the nearby Powdermills, with which this property then descended (see P12/40). [1]

**CROWHURST - ROYAL OAK COTTAGE [P12/3]**

Tenements of Crowhurst manor called Moones qr. 7/- (M56/38) and from the early/mid 17th century Bartletts qr. 5/2d (M56/5).

<1570-1608+	Ho + 37a.	In 1583 the court books refer to the property as 30a called Moones and in 1593 as 32a called Moones. [4]
<1666-1721	Ho + 55a.	Between 1608 and 1666 18a. of land called Bartletts (formerly part of Nashes (P12/4)) was merged with this property. Bartletts is referred to as a half-tenement. In 1685 Moones comprised a house, barn, brewhouse, + 32a land and the 18a called Bartletts comprised 5 different pieces of land of which one near Crowhurst Bridge (3a.2r) abutted lands of Thomas Colvill clerk (P12/15 or P12/U9); 2 others called Upper Bartletts and Lower Bartletts abut: the highway, and the fifth piece (4a) abuts Moones and the lands of Henry Weeks (P12/16). 1570-1792	Lau	Amyott	He, with his wife Joan acquired the property in 1570 he was elected beadle for the tenement in 1578 (and was therefore resident in Crowhurst). A claim was made on the property by James Avery, grandson of Thomas Avery, in 1581, but this was later dropped. In 1592 Laurance died, his wife already being dead by this date. [4]
1592-1605	Lau	Amyott	Only son of Laurance and Joan. In 1593 he acquired licence to lease the property for 9 years and in 1599 obtained a mortgage from Gregory Relf. He sold the property to Gregory Relf in 1605. [4]
1605-1606	Greg	Relf	He died in 1606. [4]
1606-1608	Mary	Relf	Of Crowhurst at her death. She was daughter and heir of Gregory. She made her will on 31/10/1608 and died unmarried before 12/1/1609. [4,5]

<1666-1685	Thos	Burton, clerk	He died holding the property. [4]
1685-1687	John	Beeston, clerk	He held in the right of his wife, Anne, to whom Thomas Burton had willed Moones. They mortgaged the property in 1685 to Robert Lovelace of Ashburnham, gent, to whom they sold in 1687. (Bartletts was left to Sarah Burton, aged 13 in 1685, with custody granted to Robert Watts. By 1695 John and Anne Beeston owned this property too). [4]

1708-1721			Robert Lovelace, gent left the property to his only daughter and heir, Mary, wife of John Coney of Burwash, gent. They immediately surrendered the property in moieties to William, son of William Gibbs of Goudhurst, gent and to

1721-1743	Nich	Maynard, gent	Francis, son of Francis Godfrey of Westfield, gent, with conditions. In 1721 William Gibbs, then 15 years old, conveyed his moiety to Nicholas Maynard of Crowhurst, gent, the conveyance being confirmed in 1726 when he obtained his majority. Francis Godfrey conveyed his moiety out right to Nicholas Maynard in 1721. [4]
1743-1743+	Thos	Bristow, gent	Of Crowhurst when he obtained the property in 1721. He died holding the property in 1743. [1,4]

[1]</p>
<p>&lt;1663 &lt;1663-1843+</p>	<p>Ho + 28a. MERGED</p>	<p>Between 1604 &amp; 1663 Bartletts was sold off (cf P12/U8) By 1663 the lands were tenanted with Hill House and the house was occupied by farm employees, being assessed in hearth tax with Hill House. (P12/9) [2,3]</p>

Thos Easton</p>	<p>He was elected beadle for Nashes &amp; Bartletts in 1553 &amp; was granted licence to lease out the property for 26 yrs in 1556. He sold it in 1561. [1] Purchased the property 1561, elected beadle for it 1585, died in possession 1597 [1]. He lived in Crowhurst, his will describes him as 'Daniel Aneston of Crowhurst' and was made 11/4/1597, proved 5/5/1597 [ESRO W/A10/48-238] Youngest son &amp; heir of Daniel. He was granted a licence to cut wood on his tenement for 30 yrs in 1604, cost £11:10:0. He died 1618, being described in his will made 10/8/1615, proved 12/9/1618, as 'Thomas Easton of Crowhurst, Yeoman' [ESRO W/A16/199-180]. [1]</p>
<p>&lt;1663-1841</p>	<p>MERGED WITH HILL HOUSE</p>	<p>In 1663 Rich Alchorne owned Nashes and by that date it formed part of Hill House Farm (P12/9).</p>

<p>&lt;1597-1597</p>	<p>Dan Easton</p>	<p>At his death the owner lived in Crowhurst (see above).</p>

<p>&lt;1702-1702+</p>	<p>Jery Sanders + Will Cramp</p>	<p>The 1702 poll tax returns show Sanders and Cramp to have been occupying Nashes. They formed the entire adult household of the house and were presumably the paid farm workers of William Cramp of Hill House, who is listed above them in the return. Presumably the two William Cramp's were related. [4]</p>

<p>? &lt;1666-1676</p>	<p>John Salmon John Reeve</p>	<p>He died holding the property. [1] Husband of Mercy, daughter &amp; heir of John Salmon. They sold the property. [1]</p>
<p>1676-1685</p>	<p>John Cramp</p>	<p>When he purchased the property he was of Hollington. He surrendered it to the use of his will 1684 &amp; died 1685. [1]</p>
<p>1685-1713</p>	<p>Mary Cramp, widow</p>	<p>Wife of John. When she was admitted she was of Castle parish, Hastings. She later married ___ Cruttenden, but was again a widow when she died 1713. Her heir was her youngest son, John Cramp, who immediately sold it [1]</p>
